You can't use Microsoft Outlook 2007 with Vista. So he had to use Windows Mail (comes with Vista) instead. Unfortunately Windows Mail doesn't have the calendar facility that Outlook has.

Mozilla backup to a certain place e.g. your flash drive

1. Double click on **MozBackup** icon on your desktop.
2. Click on **Next**
3. Make sure that there is a dot in the circle next to **Backup a Profile**
4. Click on **Mozilla Thunderbird**
5. Click on **Next**
6. Click on **Browse**
7. Click on **drop down arrow** next to **Save in**
8. When list drops down, click on the drive that you want to save it to e.g. drive E:
9. Click on **Save**
10. Click on **Default**
11. Click on **Next**
12. Click on **No** or **Yes** to **password protect** as you wish
13. Click on **Next**

The backup process starts

14. Click on **Finish**
